



1. Gender of Respondents




Interpretation: The above graph states that, 66% boys and 34% girls have submitted this SSS.

2. Class of Respondents




Interpretation: The above graph states that, 43% students are from class MBA-I and 57% students are from MBA-I.


4. Preparation of Teachers for Class




5. Communication made by Teachers


6. Teachers approach to Teaching




7. Fairness in Internal Evaluation


8. Feedback about Performance in Assignments




9. Promotion of Internship, Student Exchange and Field Visits

10. Teaching and Mentoring at the Institute






12. Communication about Course/Program Outcome




13. Follow-up for assigned task taken by Mentor


14. Use of practical approach in Teaching




15. Encouragement by Teachers


16. Teachers Encourage to overcome Weakness




17. The Institute takes efforts in mentoring, review and continuous quality improvement of teaching learning process


18. The Institute / teachers use student centric methods such as experiential learning, participative learning, problem solving for enhancing learning experience



20. Overall Quality of Teaching Learning





21. Observations / suggestions to improve the overall teaching – learning experience in your institution.






19. Teachers Encourage to Participate in Extra Curricular Activities
